# Lectio 02: Roma est Magna!

## **Naming in Ancient Rome**

Roman males had three names...

### 1. praenōmen

· similar to our first or given name

#### 2. nomen

- · similar to our last name
- · considered a family, or clan, name
- · all free-born Romans belonged to a clan.

### 3. cognōmen

- · indicated a particular branch of the clan
- · no equivalent in most Westernized cultures

### Example

 Marcus
 Tullius
 Cicero
 His first daughter would be: Tullia Prima

 praenomen
 nomen
 cognomen
 His first son would be: Marcus Tullius Cicero Primus

Daughters

Notice that the daughter simply has the father's nomen, but with a feminine ending -a.

• What would be the name of Cornelia's father?

If a family had more than one daughter, the girls were named by birth order: **Tullia Prīma** (first-born), **Tullia Secunda** (second-born), and so on.

When the daughters married, they added their husband's nomen as their second name.

Daughters
